My Losing Season

As Venerable Master of the Lodge of Perfection in 2024, it is my privilege to address you one final time in the Scottish Rite Bulletin, and report on my year. It can best be described as My Losing Season.

The Lodge of Perfection had a great start. It was all due to the work done by Mike Taldo, KCCH who was the previous Venerable Master. I want to recognize the fantastic job he did for the LOP and continued to do as the Director of Education in 2024.

To provide contextual understanding for my year, I cannot help but think in terms of Baseball. Baseball is still America's national past time. Every year begins with the call for Pitchers and Catchers to report to Spring training. My team is the Boston Red Sox, which finished just above 500 (which was a vast improvement over last year's DFL). Having lived in Connecticut most of my life, my allegiance to the Boston Red Sox was one of intelligent choice.

The LOP plan for 2024 was to help lead the Alexandria Scottish Rite to the World Series Championship of Masonry by growing attendance in the Lodge and signing the most petitions. But, despite our best efforts, Illustrious Peter Terrill, 33° reported our numbers declined at the 100th annual Scottish Rite Conference of Virginia. He served as the Valley's Conference Vice President and he explained the decline was related to the overall demographic trend of our aging population – more deaths than new petitions.

We are still the largest Valley in the Orient of Virginia, with more than 1,000 SR members. The ASR brand of Masonry is well recognized and respected. And, to my mind, I am not convinced the decline is entirely due to the demographic trend.

Illustrious Norm Hoff, 33°, Personal Representative for the SGIG in VA, is the owner rep./manager of the ASR team. Under his leadership, the ASR Executive Committee made a huge change by moving the monthly stated meeting to the Fourth Tuesday from the Second Friday. No more "We'll Get Them Next Year". It was my privilege as the Venerable Master of the LOP to vote to change game day. To be crystal clear, the shift is being done after listening to a lot of the ASR membership and it took a lot of work. Talking with younger Brothers, the tone of their remarks about Friday (negative) versus Tuesday (passionate), ultimately convinced me the change will put more fans in the stands. There are more and more young men dying to get into masonry and Scottish Rite Masonry (but they are still young men who enjoy Friday nights with friends and family).

The coaching staff saw some new names: Michael Bible, KCCH was appointed as the new ASR General Secretary and James Baker, KCCH was appointed the new Treasurer. They provided enormous support to the Lodge and the Venerable Master throughout the year.

Kudos to Chaplain John T. Tillery, KCCH for his performance. He is hitting 1000 with a newly written prayer for every single meeting! Great job.

Rick Cady, KCCH may earn All-Star recognition as director of membership. He leaned into establishing the new "Knights of the Double Eagle Award", which provides Scottish Rite Masons with a clearly defined path to earning recognition (and "bling") through attendance and activities. Attracting and Retaining Brothers

What attracts Blue Lodge Brothers to our Appendant Bodies? Some appear to hunger for a deeper understanding of the lessons, legends and allegories of the Craft degrees they received as they travelled toward becoming Master Masons, or later as they hear of the lessons of the Appendant Bodies. For those who do become active in their Lodges and other Bodies, and begin to study and participate in the conferral of those degrees, they can begin to perceive, perhaps slowly at first, how the lessons are more than just "theatrical" presentations of the arcana of the Craft. They soon discover that the broad lessons of the degrees can be applied to achieve increased success in their relationships with family,



friends, and, importantly, with society-at-large. This discovery eventually leads to a suspicion that the answers they have sought are not just fixed maxims about dealing with others, but rather, being philosophical in nature, might lead to a new level of enlightened character and awareness of their own selves.

Once this "suspicion" presents itself, we soon realize that, while no sublime end-state may ever be attained in this life, we are inexorably driven toward a goal of complete understanding. At this point, we may become more focused on the allegorical clues embedded in the lessons of the Appendant Bodies. We are soon informed by our Officers, mentors, program speakers and representatives of the many Bodies about how the various rituals might contribute to our quest for enlightenment. Our many degrees and the many books that have been written to augment those degrees have aided the personal growth of us and our Brothers over the years.

At the same time, we unfortunately will lose a Brother. I recently received a note from a Valley Honourman, who was reporting on the concerns of one of the members in his Craft Lodge. He reported that the Brother...

".., is disenchanted with the Craft (citing that it conflicts with his religion but much more so his extreme displeasure with Brethren who insert politics and religion into the Craft and are hypocritical regarding our common oaths in the treatment of other Brothers)."

He continued his report, saying...

"Our conversation was cordial as we have always had a good relationship. He did not decline my offer to sit down one-on-one at some stage for an all encompassing chat... He has already been [suspended from other Appendant Bodies] and is probably close to that happening with the Valley as well."

I had recently had a similar conversation with another Brother who was asking about the process to "leave the Scottish Rite." He cited religious concerns with the Scottish Rite's inclusion of lessons in our degrees from various world religions that were inconsistent with his own. My response to him was:

- "I'm sorry to hear this. A major desire of Freemasonry is to recognize and respect a worldwide Brotherhood of Man and the major religions practiced in honor of a Supreme Being - by any name - still while practicing our own personal beliefs. Neither the Scottish Rite, nor Freemasonry writ large, demands any particular religion, but our Scottish Rite degrees seek to increase our understanding of the beliefs of others so as to understand that we are all more alike than different. Albert Pike dwells on this matter in Chapter 14 of his "Morals and Dogma of the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry" and notes that we, as Perfect Elus, are to be 'tolerant even of intolerance."

I concluded my response to him with...

- "I would encourage you to read and study this matter more, and please call me if you would like to discuss further. If you still wish to demit from the Scottish Rite, you should notify our Valley Secretary...and he will assist you."


This Brother did demit and I explained to him that if after further consideration, he decided to reactivate his association with the SR, we would welcome him back.

Brethren, our Blue Lodge Craft Lodges and Appendant Bodies all teach the "Brotherhood of Man under the Fatherhood of God." There is no room in our Fraternity for sectarian division or rejection of a Brother's political, theological or social beliefs simply on the basis of being different from our own.

In his Preface to "Morals and Dogma," Brother Pike wrote: "The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite uses the word "Dogma" in its true sense, of doctrine, or teaching; and is not dogmatic in the odious sense of that term. Everyone is entirely free to reject and dissent from whatsoever herein may seem to him to be untrue or unsound. It is only required of him that he shall weigh what is taught and give it fair hearing and unprejudiced judgment."

Brethren, as we often say, "take due notice thereof and let it be, accordingly, so done."

New On-Line (Fillable) Petition

For the last several months, Membership Services at the Supreme Council has worked diligently to bring on board all the Valleys in the Southern Jurisdiction to use the on-line Petition process. Alexandria Valley has recently adopted the new procedure. The fillable petition can be obtained several ways:

You can go to our website and click on the "Petition" tab on the top banner of our home page. This directs you to the On-Line petition.

You can access the petition by the QR Code on our Membership Brochures. The QR Code has been updated to direct to the new On-Line petition. This is probably the easiest way to share the petition with a prospective candidate. Remember to have those Membership Brochures with you!

You can also go to the Supreme Council website and select "Join Now" at the top banner of their home page. You will be asked to indicate your Orient and Valley to access the Alexandria petition.

This fillable petition, when submitted, includes all the necessary information to include an entry for the petition signers. The candidate will enter the signers name(s) and email(s) which will generate an email where the signers add their recommendation and actually digitally sign the petition. When submitted, Sentinel (members database) creates the candidates member file which is then emailed to the Valley Secretary. This new process eliminates a lot of redundancies which occurred under the old process.
