Master of Kadosh's BIO

Brother Ronald Earl Craft, Jr., 32° was born and raised in Phoenix, Arizona. Ron was attending a local community college when the events of September 11, 2001, prompted him to join the United States Navy. In the Navy, Ron served aboard the U.S.S. Harry S. Truman, where he was a parachute rigger working with ejection seats and other aviation survival equipment. While deployed, Ron was able to travel throughout Europe and the Middle East, which inspired him to his future studies. Ron was later transferred to Naval Air Station, Lemoore, California where he met and married Sarah in 2007.

After six years, Ron left the Navy to go back home and attend Arizona State University, where he studied both political science and the Arabic language; receiving his Bachelor of Science in 2009. Afterwards, Ron attended graduate school at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies in Monterey, California. Alexandria Valley previously followed this prescribed schedule, but a decade or so ago we were granted a waiver to permit our current schedule which accommodates our ladies and guests at special dinner programs for Awards Recognition in January, Ladies Appreciation in May, Outstanding Teachers in June and for the Feast of Tishri in September. We also adjust our normal meeting agenda to include only a brief Lodge of Perfection stated meeting following each of these special dinner programs to minimize time away from our dinner guests.

Our summer schedule continues our normal busy level of activity. July typically holds our annual visit to the JMU's David Kruger Scottish Rite Summer Speech and Language Clinic, our Kena Shriners & Alexandria Valley joint family picnic, and even a fun trip to the polo matches to raise funds for our Valley's philanthropies. Etymology of the Word "Orator"

As Orator for the Alexandria Valley Chapter of Rose Croix, one of my responsibilities is to write an article for the bulletin. While contemplating various topics, it occurred to me that I should dig deeper into the definition and meaning of 'orator'.

From the Miriam-Webster dictionary:

Orator – one who delivers an oration; one distinguished for skill and power as a public speaker Oratory - an elaborate discourse delivered in a formal and dignified manner

The etymology of the word was first recorded in English circa 1374, with a meaning of 'one who pleads or argues for a cause'. It appears to be derived from the Anglo-French word oratour, the Old French word orateur, and from Latin, orator ('speaker') and orare ('to speak before a court or assembly; plead').

In ancient Rome, the art of speaking in public (Ars Oratoria) was a professional competence especially cultivated by politicians and lawyers. As the Greeks were still seen as the masters in this field, as in philosophy and most sciences, the leading Roman families often either sent their sons to study these things under a famous master in Greece (as was the case with the young Julius Caesar), or engaged a Greek teacher (under pay or as a slave). In the young revolutionary French Republic, Orateur (French for 'orator', but compare the Anglo-Saxon parliamentary speaker) was the formal title for the delegated members of the Tribunat (the body that proposed and debated) and to the Corps Législatif (the body which enacted or rejected proposed legislation) to motivate their ruling on a presented bill.

In the 19th century, orators and historians and speakers such as Mark Twain, Charles Dickens, and Col. Robert G. Ingersoll a popular politician and speaker best known for promoting critical thought were major providers of popular entertainment. A pulpit orator is a Christian author, often a clergyman, renowned for their ability to write or deliver (from the pulpit in church, hence the word) rhetorically skilled religious sermons. In some universities, the title 'Orator' is given to the official whose task it is to give speeches on ceremonial occasions, such as the presentation of honorary degrees.

This background and history led me to the Procedures Manual for the Valley of Alexandria, where the Job Description for Orator (and all of the Officers of the Valley) are outlined. The manual says, "The Orator's title is descriptive of his function. It is his duty, when requested by the (Presiding Officer of the Body), to present a lecture upon the history, philosophy, or symbolism of the Order." Three of the four bodies have an Orator (Lodge of Perfection, Chapter of Rose Croix, and Council of Kadosh). In the Consistory, a similar duty is fulfilled by the Minister of State. Perhaps not surprising given the job description, the Supreme Council also has a Grand Orator, Illustrious David O. Martinez, 33°. Ill. Martinez is also the Sovereign Grand Inspector General (SGIG) in Nevada.

In the Chapter of Rose Croix, I believe the role of Orator is best illustrated in the Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal which is conducted each March. The ceremony is a memorial service honoring the Knights of their Chapter who have passed on during the preceding year. This observance strengthens the ties of brotherly love, past and present. The ceremony consists of four parts, Part One - Remembrance of Recently Deceased Brethren; Part Two - Mystic Banquet, Part Three - Tenebrae, Extinguishing of the Lights, Part Four - Fiat Lux, Relighting the Lights. It is in Part Three that the Orator has the most powerful message as that section is closed out. Immediately after the extinguishing of the final light, the Orator says,

"In all ages, mankind has brutally murdered its liberators, reformers, and best exemplars. To us, in this season, we need look no further than the Apostle of Liberty, Equality, and Fraternity who was crucified 2000 years ago for proclaiming the Law of Love. No greater law has been uttered than His simple words.

"Love one another." At the very least, He was a great teacher of mankind, and whatever our private views may be beyond that, none can dispute the wisdom of the New Law. The Great Architect mercifully hides from our vision what is to befall us in the future. We know not what tragedies await us on the morrow. For this reason, let us work while it is yet day, and let us endeavor to fulfill our duties and dispel the darkness which you see here represented. Let each of us bring light to the world by the practice of virtue, and let us labor for its own sake, knowing that he who sows does not always reap. But rest satisfied, my Brethren and Knights, that you labor not in vain, for if one life is benefited or improved by your own, you have done well. With whom do you stand my Brethren? Are there faces in this group which you will not see next year? Will you lay a friend and Brother to rest? Let us, henceforth, celebrate the lives of our Brethren who have passed on, keeping them ever with us while we live. Remember, no man is ever truly dead as long as he lives in the hearts and memories of his friends and loved ones, and if his influences continue to act for good. So may it be with each of you. So mote it be."

Finally, as Orator of the Alexandria Valley Chapter of Rose Croix, I wish to remind you that all Good Knights are to practice Charity in all its aspects and as they derive strength to labor in the cause of Humanity from Faith and Hope.

The Alexandria Scottish Rite Education Committee: Summer Symbolic Lodge Study Group

The Alexandria Scottish Rite Education Committee has started the Master Craftsman Study group. This virtual study group will cover the online **Master Craftsman Symbolic Lodge** course provided by the Scottish Rite Southern Jurisdiction. This course focuses on developing an understanding of the Blue Lodge symbolism and its deeper meaning using Albert Pike's book, *Esoterika*. Over approximately six months, the group explores the early history of Masonry, reads early ritual exposes, and examines their development over time. The course also examines many of the deeper meanings behind symbols used in the Blue Lodge. To participate in the ASR Study Group, you must create an account on the Scottish Rite Southern Jurisdiction website https://scottishrite.org/ and purchase the virtual course, which consists of the quizzes and other study material. The **Master Craftsman: Symbolic Lodge** (\$40.00) and the book, *Esoterika: The Symbolism of the Blue Degrees of Freemasonry* (\$52.95) can be purchased here: https://mastercraftsmancollege.org/courses. 2023 Teacher of the Year Awards

The Washington Post Educational Foundation annually selects one Principal and one Teacher from the District of Columbia, plus the ten Virginia and eight Maryland public school districts nearest to Washington, D.C, as finalists for their Principal and Teacher of the Year Awards. The Post also reviews private school nominations to select a single finalist for consideration. Following the selection of one Principal and one Teacher finalist from each of the eighteen school districts, DC and all private schools, the Post announces its selection for Award of the region's Outstanding Principal and the Outstanding Teacher of the year. Our Scottish Rite fully agrees with the Post's Educational Foundation's stated position that quality education is essential to the wellbeing of our society, and good teachers are the foundation of our educational system.

On 9 June, we held Alexandria Valley's 24th annual Outstanding Teacher Recognition banquet. In each of those 24 years since 2000 when we began, we have invited three teachers, selected on a rotational basis from the ten school districts in our Northern VA area, to be our honored guests at our Recognition and Awards banquet, and to receive a Certificate of Appreciation and a \$500 check from the Valley. Our invited honorees are also encouraged to bring their family members, colleagues and school leadership with them to share in the celebration of their achievement. Our Venerable Master, Brother Mike Taldo, KCCH, began the banquet and later turned the ceremony over to III. Phil Rhodes, 33°, for the awards presentations.

Our three 2023 Outstanding Teachers invited to this year's Awards Banquet were Kathleen Jacoby, the Herndon High School band director from the Fairfax County Public Schools District, Nathan Hershberger, a 5th grade math and science teacher from George Mason Elementary School of the Alexandria City Public Schools, and Julia Noble, a 1st grade teacher at Mount Daniel Elementary School in the Falls Church City Public Schools District.

Ms. Jacoby brought her husband, daughter, colleague, County Music Supervisor, and assistant School Principal, all of whom were also musicians - it was indeed "a joyful noise." Mr. Hershberger, whose wife had delivered a baby daughter only hours prior, was understandably otherwise engaged but was ably represented by his school Principal, Dr. Seazante Oliver, who will convey the certificate and check to him. Ms. Noble was preempted by an emergent conflict and her certificate and check will be delivered to her at a later date.

Ms. Jacoby and Dr. Oliver were each offered an opportunity to respond, and each expressed gratitude for the Valley's recognition and support of public education and its dedicated educators. It was, as it is every year, a rewarding and enjoyable event - one you should all plan to attend next year.


