A New Beginning

Terence M. Smith, Venerable Master, Alexandria Lodge of Perfection

As Venerable Master of the Alexandria Scottish Rite's Lodge of Perfection it is my pleasure to wish each of you a Happy New Year. It is a time when Scottish Rite Masons make New Year's Resolutions. Of course, there are different types of resolutions, which can have a lot to do with how well those are kept. "Promoting World Peace" is a favorite resolution for many people because it is a worthwhile goal, even if it is never going to be achieved.

We as Perfect Elues can resolve to inculcate the virtues recommended in the 4-14th degrees, both inside and outside the Lodge. These virtues build upon those so strongly recommended in the Symbolic Lodge. By keeping track of how well we practice even one of these virtues, every day, can improve ourselves in Masonry. Did we practice, say, patience? Just give yourself a Plus or Minus before going to bed.

The ASR LOP resolutions for 2024 need to advance the Alexandria Scottish Rite's No. 1 goal of growing membership. We also must work on improving ritual and conducting all Lodge business in a timely manner.

The ASR LOP is the 4th through 14th degrees, which are called *Ineffable Degrees* because their principal purpose is the investigation and contemplation of the unutterable name of Deity. The degrees amplify the legend of the Master Mason degree, and stories of the biblical era, leading up to the completion of King Solomon's Temple. These degrees are designed to impress more forcefully the teachings of the first three degrees. Each of our degrees takes it theme from one of the many names of God, "God is Just", "God is Merciful", "God is Love". The Lodge of Perfection encourages contemplative Masons to continue the path for Light and the awakening of one's personal spirituality.

The symbol of the Lodge of Perfection (4°-14°) is gold colored and depicts a compasses, open to sixty degrees, resting upon a graduated segment which bears the Roman numerals III, V, VII, IX. Suspended from the hinge is a radiant five pointed star, and on the summit of the compasses is a crown. The compasses remind us that science, united to honor and virtue, made the architects of the temple the companions of kings.

Venerable Master's BIO

Brother Terence M. Smith was born in Detroit, Michigan and moved to Cleveland, Milwaukee and eventually Atlanta, Georgia to attend a military high school/college. He worked his way through college by cooking in restaurants and entered St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia, PA, as a sophomore at age 16. Bro. Terence quickly earned a BA in English. After graduation, he went to work for U.S. Senator Gary Hart as a speech writer and campaign worker. After Senator Hart resigned, he started his career on Wall Street working for E.F. Hutton & Co., Citibank, AMBAC Insurance, and Global Guaranty. In 1992, Bro. Terence founded "Smith's Research & Gradings," specializing in Critical Infrastructure Assets and municipal bonds, providing independent conflict-free credit analytics to institutional investors.

Brother Terence's Masonic journey started in August 2015, when he was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason at Henry Lodge No. 57, Oakton, VA. He then joined Columbia Chapter No. 2 Royal Arch Masons, Washington D.C. Closer to home in the Scottish Rite (Life Member), during Covid, Bro. Terence was the Chief of the Alexandria Scottish Rite Knights of St. Andrew. He also highly recommends the Scottish Rite Master Craftsman Course (Levels 1, 2, 3) which he completed as a correspondence course. Bro. Terence is a life member of the Scottish Rite Research Society, which has provided him many hours of insightful reading. He enjoyed being a Cast Member of the 5°, 14°, 15°, 20°, 28° and 32°. Bro. Terence is also honored to belong to Virginia Counsel No. 12 Knight Masons and C.A. Sinclair Council of Allied Masonic Degrees.

Bro. Terence is happily married to Pamela Kilbourn Smith and live with their dog, Seamus, a Golden Doodle, in Great Falls, VA. Bro. Terence has a son, TJ (Terence Junior), who was married last June to Kaitlyn at the Saratoga Resort on Lake George in NY. The Scottish Rite Funeral

"Forms and Traditions of the Scottish Rite," published by The Supreme Council, 33°, S.J., U.S.A., provides much information about our Scottish Rite, its various forms of opening and closing the Bodies of the Rite, Balloting procedure, and general guidelines for conferring the degrees and conducting special programs such as the Feast of Tishri or the Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal. It also provides guidance, protocol and script for the Scottish Rite Funeral Ceremony.

Some twenty-five years ago, Alexandria Valley conducted the Scottish Rite Funeral Ceremony for one of our Brothers who had previously made it known that he desired to have the ceremony performed when his time to lay down his working tools eventually arrived. When that time did inevitably arrive, the ceremony was led by Illustrious Walter Downs, 33°, Grand Cross, who was simultaneously both our General Secretary and the Personal Representative of Illustrious David Kruger, the SGIG in Virginia. It was, even then, something that was not often performed in our Valley, and it has not been performed here since then.

Until recently, when on the 20th of November, Alexandria Scottish Rite Valley conducted the Scottish Rite Funeral Ceremony for our recently departed Worshipful Brother Gerald Davis van Antwerp, 32°. Our late Brother's family stated that they had been informed by him of the Ceremony with his request that, upon his demise, our Valley be asked to perform the Funeral Ceremony for him. This, then, was a rare opportunity to both honor our late Brother's request, and to experience a very impressive and poignant Scottish Rite ceremony... something that most of our members were seeing for the first time.

The ceremony provides a strong reminder that in gathering together following the loss of a Brother, "we should assemble in the character of Freemasons to conduct his funeral in the manner of Masonry." The service continues with "... it is not done to persons undiscerning as a fallen tree, but whose souls yet live, and can perceive our neglect and be witnesses of our transient affections and forgetfulness; and if not so, yet God sees us."

The ceremony reminds us of those commitments we have made to one another as Brother Masons, as well as to the families of those lost Brothers. We are reminded that "Those things that can outlast us - our works, our words, our immortal thoughts, our influence, and the effects of our good deeds are more to those that survive us than we ourselves are. We pass away and are soon forgotten, but these continue and live."

So mote it be.

2024 Glass Scholarship Applications

The Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce that the 2024 Glass Scholarship Applications will be available starting **January 1**, **2024**, on the Alexandria Scottish Rite website. The Alexandria Valley Scottish Rite Glass Scholarships provide financial support in the form of several annual \$2,000 scholarships for high school seniors or first-time freshmen students and renewals to previous awardees who are U.S. citizens and pursuing:

- a) A four-year college degree program
- b) A two-year junior college associate degree program, or
- c) A career-focused post-secondary school technical training program

Scholarships are open to graduating high school seniors and first-time freshmen and previous year awardees who are related to a member of the Alexandria Scottish Rite in good standing (living or deceased) or who are members of one of our Masonic Youth Groups (DeMolay, Rainbow, or Job's Daughters). The number of scholarships presented in any year will be determined based on available funds. Applications are due to the Valley Secretary's Office postmarked no later than March 30, 2024. No late applications will be accepted. The expansion of applications to career-focused post-secondary technical training programs (i.e., Vo-Tec programs/training schools) was made several years ago and to date, no scholarships have been awarded. The Scholarship Committee would love to see this change this year, so please encourage worthy and deserving graduating Seniors or First-Year Freshmen students who meet the requirements to apply as soon as possible. The Valley membership is encouraged to share this far and wide amongst the Valley Blue Lodges for as much exposure as possible.

Master Craftsman 1

As Free and Accepted Masons, we all experienced the three Blue Lodge or Symbolic degrees. On their completion however, we are only given very surface level explanations of what those degrees are telling us to do. Illustrious Brother Albert Pike spent a good portion of his life uncovering the reasons our first three degrees were developed. Pike came to believe that the degrees

contained instructions, encoded in the symbols, which he recorded in his book Esoterika: The Symbolism of the Blue Degrees of Freemasonry. Over the past few months, the Alexandria Scottish Rite Education team has held a study group, using the Master Craftsman 1 material provided by the Supreme Council, Southern Jurisdiction. The group began by discussing Pike's sources which include early exposures of the degrees. Next, they discussed several symbols with which every Freemason should be familiar, however the actual meanings may not have been apparent. While Esoterika is one of Pike's more accessible works, working though the course in a virtual study group format helps to clarify his original ideas, generate discussion, and debate his conclusions.

Life Membership:

One of the opportunities offered by the Alexandria Valley is a life membership option which locks in your dues against any future increases. Over the long run this can be quite a savings - and is one less bill to worry about in the future. It also means that you will not have to have to write dues checks each year or ever have to worry about being suspended for non-payment of dues.

The "Operating Plan" referred to in the application for life membership simply provides that:

- Current year's dues must be paid before purchasing Life Membership.
- The fee is not refundable or transferable to a Valley outside of the Orient of Virginia.
- A Life Member certificate shall be issued to each purchaser.
- The funds from purchases shall be placed in a special Trust Fund administered by the Trustees.

Age 75 and above - 2/3 of \$3,650 = \$2,433.00

THE CORRECT POSITION DURING SCOTTISH RITE PRAYER

Predicated upon its basic foundation of belief in a personal God, the Scottish Rite gives primary importance in its Degrees and at its meetings to prayer. While there is an established position and sign to be used by all Scottish Rite Masons during prayer, this position and sign are sometimes not uniformly practiced. Scottish Rite Masons (except when engaged in ritual at the altar) stand during prayer, with caps remaining on the head as part of a uniform. What is also required is giving the accompanying "Sign of the Good Shepherd." This is done by folding the arms, the left over the right, with the out-stretched fingers touching the shoulders. This position is comfortable and easily remembered if it is realized that the sign represents the Good Shepherd carrying a lamb around his neck and holding its feet by his crossed hands. During the prayer, in this position, the head is slightly bowed.

Remembering a Masonic Brother's Story from Italy

Sei un massone? These were the first Italian words spoken to me after being raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in Vicenza, Italy. It means, "Are you a Freemason?" At that time, I didn't know what to say except for, "grazie" or "thank you." Everyone got a laugh. As the newest Master Mason, I still had no idea what was really going on. We have all been there.

Current events in the world, plus a the "Statement of Scottish Rite Freemasonry and Religion," on November 16, 2023, from III. James D. Cole, 33° SGC, made me start thinking about my time being a Mason in Italy. Especially since Italy is not the most welcoming place for Masons.

My Masonic journey started in Italy. My Mother Lodge is a military lodge in Aviano, (Northern) Italy and I was raised by Brothers from another military lodge in Vicenza, Italy. During my degree, a few Italian Freemasons were present and Brother Fabrizio welcomed me in Italian, He ended up becoming a life-long friend until his passing a few years ago. He was 30 years my senior. We had many philosophical discussions about Masonry and life in general, over copious amounts of vino (wine) both in Italy and here in Northern Virginia. One conversation, three months after I was raised, was about Masonry in Italy, and opened my eyes to how different countries view Masonry.

Brother Fabrizio began by saying that Italian Masons don't "advertise" that they are Masons, like we do here in America, and that it would be difficult to find a square and compass in Italy, unless you know where to look. He said that Italian Masons have been persecuted over the centuries, by either religious institutions or by political parties. Therefore, they are cautious in their actions and have long memories, especially Brother Fabrizio.

He always wanted to be a Mason, since his father, grandfather, and great-grandfather were Masons. It is like a rite of passage for the men in his family. I will always remember him saying, "If the winds of history blew a different direction, life would be different, and I would not be sitting here in front of you today." Brother Fabrizio was born a few years after World War II. He told me how his father and members of his lodge supported Benito Mussolini many years prior to the war. In 1925, Mussolini banned Masonry in Italy since it didn't coincide with fascism. Brother Fabrizio's father hid his Masonic affiliation and managed to maintain his banking career during the war.

That was until a bit over a year before the end of World War II, between 1943 and 1944. Brother Fabrizio's father went on a business trip to Austria where he and another co-worker were captured and sent to Mauthausen concentration camp as political prisoners for being Freemasons. Someone in the Milan bank where he worked, had reported them.

The conditions at Mauthausen were horrible, and Brother Fabrizio's father was forced to work from sunrise to sundown every day or risk being executed. His father didn't see his co-worker/Brother ever again, since he went off to another part of the camp. Eventually, his father made it out of the concentration camp alive and was always grateful for the Americans who rescued him.

When Brother Fabrizio was eight years old, he remembered finding his father in the barn, in tears, with a newspaper lying next to him. It was early May and on the front page of the paper was an article about the anniversary of the end of World War II in Europe. That was also the same day Brother Fabrizio found out that his father was a Freemason and that he knew he wanted to be one.

I do miss Brother Fabrizio, since he taught me a lot. Especially seeing life through other people's eyes. Two of his quotes have stuck with me:

- "Be kind to everyone you meet, since they are fighting their own war."
 Russian Proverb
- "Knowledge is realizing that the street is one way; wisdom is looking in both directions anyway." Albert Einstein
